Program Description

It is a frequent assumption that sterilization and high-level disinfection (HLD) are limited to the main operating room (OR) and sterile-processing departments. However, accrediting agencies are beginning to place a greater focus on hospital-based clinics and satellite practices that use instruments and equipment in their practice.

For many newly acquired physician practices and facilities, the requirements of accreditation agencies are new and unexpected. These entities have not been surveyed by accreditation agencies in the past. In fact, few acquiring hospitals have included accreditation readiness in their acquisition plans.

Organizations tend to encounter a much greater focus on infection control during survey, especially efforts to reduce the transmission of infections from one patient to another. For this reason, there is an increased focus on sterilization and HLD to improve patient safety by preventing procedural-site infections.

Under this increased scrutiny, healthcare organizations are struggling. Year after year, Joint Commission Standard IC.02.02.01 continues to be one of the most challenging standards for not only for hospitals, but also for ambulatory care, office-based surgery practices, critical access hospitals, and home care.

During this 60-minute activity, expert faculty examine the impact of sterilization and HLD processes outside of the OR, and how these policies and procedures will help organizations ensure that by implementing these strategies, they can reduce or prevent the spread of infections.
